FOUNDERS PIONEER VILLAGE (OPENING JULY 2, 2022) FEATURING DUKE HUNT MUSEUM, RUSS' GARAGE AND THE PIONEER VILLAGE

Founders Pioneer Village has undergone some changes since it was last opened in 2019. Last year, museum employees, board members, friends of the museum, and our council representative, Alana Bishop, spent many hours packing, unpacking and setting up the Duke Hunt Museum in the newly renovated Slate River Hall located on the Founders Pioneer Village site at the corner of Hwy 61 and Gillespie Rd. While we were busy doing that, the Municipality of Oliver Paipoonge constructed a new building located on the east portion of the Founders property. This building, partially funded by a Heritage grant, is the new home for a large auto and speedway related donation from Russ Wanzuk. 

Land Based Activities Promoted in Neebing

Many of us that live in Neebing already thrive on the abundance of natural space that we have and the important connection to the land. Whether you are a visitor or live here, or perhaps you are a farmer, hunter, enjoy fishing, boating, sledding, hiking or are an outdoor enthusiast, there is so much breath taking nature to enjoy here in Neebing.

As a senior with Anishinaabe ancestry, I am in absolute heaven living here. I moved here 4 and half years ago and have made this land my home and homestead for my descendants. I do what I can to provide awareness to anyone that is interested about why land based activities are so important to everyone, especially Indigenous folk. Our very identity is linked to our connection with the land, community, language, and our cultural practices. As an individual that used to suffer with identity based mental health issues, I understand why the connection to the land is vital to living a balanced life.

The name 'Neebing' I believe comes from an Ojibwe word 'Niibing', which roughly translates to 'in the summer'. I would say it is very appropriate for this land that is so special in all the seasons and especially in the summertime. I think about what our ancestors have been doing on this land for centuries and how those activities were in harmony with the land.

As a result of my own experiences and the charity and businesses that I support, my entire focus is about bringing land based activities to everyone, young and young at heart. Through the continued support and encouragement of the local council and staff of the Municipality of Neebing, I can provide land based activities to our visitors and residents of Neebing.

Some of my greatest entertainment and joy comes from this land including watching the goslings take their first swims from Little Trout Bay, up my little river in my backyard with their parents. As part of the hoof clan, I am always very moved by the deer stopping in and the mama moose and her baby (or yearling) each spring. There is also usually a bear that likes to stretch out on the grass on the other side of the river and munching on something delicious. I especially love to watch the 'ocean' of fireflies in the heat of the summer.

There is a free land based activity being offered by the charity Blue Sky Community Healing Centre entitled 'Honouring Nibi (Water) Beings' on July 20. What's Been Happening at Council Meetings?

Since the June edition, there has been two regular Council meetings on June 1 and 15.

At the regular Council meeting on June 1, the following matters were considered:

- Council heard a deputation from representatives of the Urban Abbey.
- Council passed a resolution to support the primary care clinic in Kakabeka Falls.
- Council reviewed correspondence from residents related to the Memory Road boat launch and the recycling bins at the landfill sites..

At the regular Council meeting on June 15, the following matters were considered:

- Council heard a deputation from a property owner regarding Pit Road.
- Council approved the inserts to be included with the final tax bills.
- Council reviewed requests for use of the Cloud Lake Boat launch to haul water for Ministry of Transportation highway improvement projects.
- Council reviewed a request for use of municipal road allowance for a fibre installation project near Boundary Drive.

There was a Special Council meeting held on June 29th but will be reported in the next addition of the Neebing News.

The summer Council meetings will be held on July 20th and August 10th.

Summer Fire Safety in Neebing



Although COVID is predicted to remain with us for some time yet, it is nevertheless wonderful to experience our steady transition toward a return to the pleasures of person-to-person contact and communication. While it is still prudent to adopt precautions (masking, gloves, distancing) in our approach to some situations, we

hope that going forward, our positive management of the pandemic situation will allow us all to put related health issues and concerns behind us ... moving forward with confidence and determination.

It was very gratifying to see a significant number of exhibitors, participants and community visitors present at the Tailgate Sale on June 18th. The weather was exceptional, and the bugs were (for the most part) 'considerate'. It was exciting to see and hear neighbours and extended family members happily engaging - catching each other up on the news of family and friends, and sharing stories that have been difficult to relate personally these past few years. A 'High 5' to the NFRA members who, after careful discussion and deliberation, decided to in fact go ahead this year with the delivery of the '2022' event - 'breaking the ice' per se. The committee successfully planned and presented our first 'live' event in Neebing since the beginning days of the pandemic. **Awesome Effort ... Excellent Result!**

Fire threats for July are heavily focused on outdoor activities, especially with regard to BBQs, campfires, fireworks, natural disaster events, smoking hazards and wildfire concerns. Fortunately, the cool temperatures and abundant moisture experienced in Neebing over most of our 2022 Spring have kept wildfire threat levels very low. However, a few days of hot, dry air, combined with a little wind, can rapidly elevate wildfire threat to dangerous levels! As wildfire threats increase, it becomes increasingly important to be cautious in all of our outdoor activities that might involve heat or flame.

The Ontario Association of Fire Chiefs provides an extensive and useful 'on line' resource of summer fire safety tips for a wide range of summer activities at: <https://www.oafc.on.ca/spring-summer-fire-safety-tips>. This is a great site to bookmark on your home computer or Smartphone, as it is able to provide you with a quick and easy reference if/when you have questions about fire safety concerns.

Those of us who are fortunate enough to live or recreate in our beautiful forested Neebing, must assume responsibility for ensuring that we do not inadvertently start a wildfire, damaging or destroying both the natural and human environment we so enjoy. **Wildfire** is a major summertime concern! In order to help minimize the threat of human-caused wildfires, both the province and the municipality provide fire-safe regulations to address the of hazards of potential fire-causing activities. These regulations in conjunction with; information on current **fire-threat levels**, awareness of **safe burning** practices and adherence to the requirements outlined on Neebing fire permits all help ensure that our community maintains a high level of resiliency to wildfire threats from within. **Be Fire Safe!!**

Following is a brief summary of key requirements for remaining firesafe during our regulated **FIRE SEASON (April 1 - October 31 inclusive)** each year.

- **NO DAYTIME BURNING is permitted in Neebing! Open fires are restricted to an earliest ignition time - 2 hours before sunset - and must be extinguished by 2 hours after sunrise.**
 - **FIRE Permits are required for all open burning** in Neebing during the fire season.
 - **Burn pile sizes are restricted during the fire season.**
 - **Ensure you have the proper tools and water supply available** (as written on your permit).
 - **NO Burning if wind is >15 kph.**
 - **Restricted Fire Zone or Fire Ban notices are put in place when conditions are High or Extreme. They Restrict all burning and much work being done in the bush.**
- Sunset, Sunrise and Wind conditions can be easily checked on the Environment Canada weather site at; https://weather.gc.ca/city/pages/on-100_metric_e.html, and **Fire Danger levels** are viewable on line on the MNR web site at; <https://www.lioapplications.lrc.gov.on.ca/ForestFireInformationMap/index.html?viewer=FIM.FFIM>. This mapping is updated daily and plots the danger levels geographically. In a municipality as large as Neebing with 10% of the world's freshwater to on its eastern boundary and rugged topography, conditions may vary in different areas of the municipality. Local Neebing weather conditions and regularly upgraded fire hazard levels are also viewable on the municipal webpage at www.neebing.org. If in doubt about whether or not it is OK to start your fire, error on the side of caution and hold off until you are assured that conditions are safe.

Smoke in the air may be from local or distant fires, and a quick look at the Fire Smoke Map can be most helpful in identifying probable sources. <https://firesmoke.ca/forecasts/current/>

And please don't forget - if you think there is evidence of a fire in your area, or are having any difficulties controlling your own fire, or there are signs it is starting to spread beyond the boundaries established for it - **Call 911 immediately** so that help can get on the way to you quickly!

Emergency Fire Fighting Water Sources

A reliable and available supply of water is key to all fire fighting. In Neebing all water used in fire fighting comes from surface ponds, lakes or creeks with two large tanker trucks used to transport water from the closest available water source to the fire scene. Seasonal variations can greatly impact availability and accessibility to these water sources. Neebing currently has two Dry Fire Hydrants, one located at East Oliver Lake and the other at Little Trout Bay, that provide year round, 24/7, dependable and easy hook up to reliable water sources. Neebing Fire is looking at the potential to expand the number of dry hydrants in the community to im-

prove access to reliable year-round water sources for firefighting use. If you are aware of a reliable and readily accessible source of water in your neighbourhood, let us know and we will add it to our inventory of water sources in Neebing and assess it for potential as a future emergency dry hydrant location. Simply send an email, subject - Water Source - identifying the location of the water source to neebing@neebing.org or if you prefer call the office at 474-5331 and provide location details of your water source.



Tips for Backyard Burning

- Don't burn when the weather is dry or windy.
- Only burn dry, natural vegetation, never trash or plastic.
- The site should be surrounded by 10 feet of dirt or gravel on all sides.
- Make sure to keep your burn small and manageable.
- Always stay with the fire until it is out, and drown the fire with water.





WOMEN'S INSTITUTE RECIPES

CRUSTLESS QUICHE

2 cups chopped cooked broccoli salmon
1 1/3 cups shredded cheddar cheese
1 1/3 cups of milk
1/2 tsp. salt

1 or 2 cups of chopped cooked chicken or diced ham or 1 cup flaked tuna or salmon
2/3 cup of chopped onion
4 or 5 beaten eggs
1/4 tsp. pepper

3/4 cup of Bisquick

Heat your oven to 400.

Oil a large pie plate.

In a medium bowl, mix together the chopped broccoli, cheese, chicken or diced ham or drained and flaked tuna or salmon. Mix in the chopped onion.

Pour the mixed ingredients into the large greased pie plate.

Beat the eggs with the milk and the Bisquick mix until smooth.

Add the salt and pepper then pour this on top of pie mixture. Lightly stir together.

Bake for 30 to 40 minutes until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean.

Sweet/Sour Meatballs

1 lb. ground beef. Mix 4 ingredients.
1/3 cup bread crumbs. Roll into 30 meatballs and fry in oil. Drain meatballs.
1 egg
1 cup chopped onion

1/3 cup white vinegar Bring to a boil stirring constantly. Sauce will thicken
2 Tablespoons soya sauce. Place with meatballs in a casserole. Bake covered at 250 degrees for
3/4 cup brown sugar 2 hrs. Serve with rice. (You may add sliced red peppers while meatballs
1/3 cup ketchup. cook)
2 Tablespoons cornstarch

Berry Blush Punch

1 can frozen berry punch (McCain is one brand u can use)
1 can frozen lemonade
1 litre pineapple juice (fresh is best) available in refrigerated juice section
1 - 2 litre bottle of Ginger Ale (diet or reg) - pour in pop in slowly to prevent foaming
1 dozen or so ice cubes

Mix together in punch or large bowl.

Add pop and ice cubes just before serving

Decorate with thinly sliced oranges, lemons, and/or strawberries.

After rhubarb, strawberries are often the first crop of fruit that is ready for harvest. It is definitely a part of our summer celebrations in the month of July.

Nutritionally they are packed with vitamin C, low in calories and high in fibre.

Interestingly, strawberry mythology says that strawberries are a love producing fruit beloved by the goddesses such as Venus and Aphrodite.

So, to celebrate this delicious berry, here is a hot milk cake recipe used for many years by the women of the Slate River Women's Institute.

This month's recipe was submitted by Doreen Rogers, a long time Slate River WI member. In the past Slate River WI members used to prepare the cakes for our Annual Strawberry Festival. We would each bake and donate 2 or 3 of these cakes which were cut into serving size pieces then served up covered with a mound of strawberries and a scoop of vanilla ice cream.

HOT MILK CAKE

4 eggs 2 cups flour 1/4 tsp. salt
2 tsp. baking powder 2 tbsp. butter
1 cup of milk 1 tsp. vanilla

Beat eggs until fluffy. Add sugar, beat well. Add flour, salt and baking powder. Mix well.

Heat the milk, with the butter and the vanilla. Slowly add this to the first mixture.

Pour into a greased 9 by 13 pan. Bake at 350 for 30 to 35 minutes.

Now this cake can simply be cut into serving sizes and then on top of each serving add a good sized helping of strawberries and a big dollop of whipped cream or vanilla ice cream.

Alternatively, try out this icing recipe.

YUMMY ICING

1 cup of brown sugar 1/2 cup butter
2 tbsp. milk

1 cup coconut 1 cup chopped nuts
Heat in microwave until butter is melted and mixture can be easily combined. Spread over top of cake after it is baked. Return the cake into the oven for about 5 minutes to set the icing and brown slightly.

- drink water;
- wash your face with cool water

If you don't feel better soon, seek medical help immediately.

If you are indoors:

- stay indoors to limit sun exposure
- take frequent cool showers or baths
- stay on lower floors if there's no air conditioning
- drink water and eat light, regular meals — avoid using salt

If you are outdoors:

- spend the hottest part of the day in air-conditioned buildings
- drink water every 15 to 20 minutes even if you aren't thirsty
- dress in light-coloured, loose-fitting clothing covering as much of your skin as possible
- wear a wide-brimmed hat to protect your face
- wear full UVA and UVB protection sunglasses
- apply sunscreen with SPF 15 or higher 20 minutes before going outside
- apply lip balm with an SPF 15 or higher

Prepare Now

Take the following steps so you and your family are prepared in the event of an emergency:

- cover windows that receive morning or afternoon sun with drapes, shades or awnings
- include extra water, sunscreen and sunglasses (with full UVA and UVB protection) in your emergency survival kit
