New Landfill Punch Cards 2024

What's Been Happening at Council Meetings?

Since the December edition, there have been two regular meetings of Council on December 6 and 20, 2023. There was one special meeting of Council on December 6, 2023 for planning matters.

At the special Council meeting on December 6th, the Committee of the Whole reviewed an application for severance of a property at Jarvis Bay Road West and Highway 61. At the regular Council meeting on December 6th, the following matters were considered:

- Council heard a deputation from Neebing Fire Rescue Association. During their presentation they made a presentation of Appreciation to Chaschuk Enterprises for their contributions to the wood raffle.
- Council approved the recommendation from the Committee of the Whole to approve the severance application for the property at Jarvis Bay Road West and Highway 61.
- Council passed a resolution to request that the Federal Government reconsiders their definition of a small and rural community for eligibility for the Climate Action Incentive Payment Rural Supplement.
- Council approved a letter to the Ministry of Transportation requesting that they reconsider the request to allow snowmobile crossing at the Pigeon River Border Crossing.
- Council approved a letter of support for the Fort William Golf and Country Club's application to NOHFC.

At the regular Council meeting December 20th, the following matters were considered:

• Council heard a deputation from the Neebing Recreation Committee regarding the Blake Hall 100th Anniversary Celebration Event.

- Council heard a deputation from Neebing Emergency Services regarding a fire event on Boundary Drive.
- Council reviewed the maintenance program for Cottage Drive West.
- Council approved a budget for the Blake Hall 100th Anniversary Celebration Event
- Council approved the municipal insurance policy renewal proposal.
- Council directed staff to research possible projects related to the Rural Transit Solutions Fund.
- Council supported a resolution from the City of Sudbury requesting amendments to the Oc-

cupational Health and Safety Act. The next Council meeting will be held on January 17, 2024. There will be a Special Council meeting on January 24, 2024 to review the 2024 budget. Regular Council meetings are normally scheduled for the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month. This article contains only highlights from Council meetings - visit the website to see the approved minutes from each of the meetings. The minutes of each meeting are approved at the following meeting and are posted on the website once they have been approved and signed. If vou don't have internet capabilities, you can always contact the office for copies of approved minutes.

Meeting agendas are always posted online on the Friday prior to the Wednesday meeting. Come out and see what your Council is doing on your behalf. Feel free to contact the Municipal Office for further information or with input into any of the items that Council is considering. The meetings are now being held at the Municipal Office, but there is the option to attend virtually as well. The links to login to the meetings are posted on our website in the calendar details.

It's Municipal Budget time again! Council reviews the annual budget more than once before it is approved. The first review of the 2024 Budget is scheduled for Wednesday January 24th beginning at 6 PM. This meeting can be joined online, or you are welcome to attend in person at the Municipal Office. Online meeting details will be available before the meeting at www.neebing.org or at the office.


The first draft budget for 2024 will include:

- Projected revenue including grants
- Projected operating expenses such as the costs for services
- 2024 Capital Projects such as

Road Work Projects, Blake Hall Arena, and Alf Olsen Memorial Park Rink

Legislation requires that Municipalities must pass a balanced budget and the first budget meeting is to identify and prioritize expenses, with more work done in future meetings to balance revenues and expenses.

Past budgets and Financial Statements can be viewed on the Municipal website. A copy of the first draft budget and the open session report that Council will review on January 24th is available the Monday before the meeting on the Neebing website, or at the office.

This survey highlights areas for improvement within Neebing. These areas can include future projects like upgrading or adding facilities (docks, playgrounds, batting cage, and soccer posts), holding events (fishing derbies, food tour, and farmers markets), and maintenance. The results of the survey will guide planning for future improvements within the Municipality.

Highway 61 Improvements

Construction along Highway 61 between Jarvis Bay Road and Highway 130 is continuing over the winter months. The work includes addressing drainage deficiency, culvert replacement or rehabilitation, guiderail replacement/adjustments, platform widening, shoulder correction, utility relocations, entrance rehabilitation and paving.

Delays and lane closures will be ongoing until the project is complete in 2024. Please be patient and help keep all the workers safe. Garbage Every bag of regular household garbage requires a Municipal Garbage Bag Tag. We issue a set amount of tags to residents on an annual basis. You can collect your tags at the municipal landfill sites during regular hours of operation. You MUST present photo ID to the attendant in order to receive your tags.

Please remember to BAG your cans and plastics and FLATTEN your cardboard.We do not accept plastic grocery bags.

Lakehead Region **Conservation Authority**

Snow surveys conducted on January 2nd indicate that snow depth is approximately 23% of average for the beginning of the year ranging from 6-7.2 centimetres, compared to the average of 30 centimetres. As a result of the lack of precipitation, the LRCA has upgraded the Low Water Condition to a Level II Low Water Condition, based on the previous three months only receiving approximately 57% of the average precipitation. A Level II Low Water condition is declared when received precipitation ranges between 40-60% of average. A Level II Low Water Condition indicates minor supply problems with the potential for major supply problems. Area residents on wells are advised to monitor and adjust their usage accordingly.







As the month of Christmas festivities comes to an end, I open my blinds to see the remanence of Christmas through colourful lights on the street. Soon, kids will be back to school, and that spare bedroom family

Although the lack of snow thus far has been somewhat of a blessing in disguise, it is important to keep an eye on your pipes as snow provides a natural insulation that is not present this year. Frozen pipes introduce a world of issues that can be somewhat difficult to resolve. The Neebing community in particular relies on wells and septic tanks which can present issues especially in the cold winter months. If freezing does occur, ensure to call a service to have the problem averted as it is essential to have running water for not only comfort but also fire safety in your home.

As we ring in the new year of 2024, lets welcome another year full of fire safety for our Neebing community. It is once again abundantly important to pay close attention to candle safety. Open flame proves time and time again to be the leading cause of house fires. Remember to never light a candle near anything flammable, and to never leave a candle unattended. Sticking to these simple

a- safety measures could very well as save you and your loved ones.

As Christmas is now behind us, the safe disposal of your holiday tree can often be overlooked. As your tree begins to dry out, the dried needles and branches introduce a potential fire hazard into your home, especially in being so close to an outlet and wrapped in lights. It is important to keep your tree watered until you are ready to dispose of it and to remove all decorations before disposing in the correct facility. Do not burn your tree in a woodstove or your tree once it is past its lifetime creates an unnecessary hazard in your home.

Ice fishing is an increasingly common sport but can be dangerous if not proceeded with caution. With a warm start to this winter, it is important to check ice thickness before walking or driving across any ice. Ice must be at least 4 inches in thickness before it is safe to walk across. Falling through the ice can quickly lead to hypothermia and eventually death. It is also important to know the body of water you are travelling on, and to never go alone.

Although we have been fortunate so far, snow is often seen to block vents on the exterior of your home. It is crucial to ensure all outdoor vents remain unblocked. A blocked vent can lead to carbon monoxide buildup in your home which can be life threatening. After any large snowfall, take a quick walk around your house as a preventative meas-
