### When to Contact the OPP

#### When to Call 911

If someone's health, immediate safety or property is threatened, call 911. When calling 911, be specific about what services(s) you need, ie: Police, Fire and/or Ambulance and provide as much detail as possible.

#### When to Call the Non-Emergency Line

For non-emergency events or minor crimes you can either:

- Call the 24-hour toll-free number at 1-888-310-1122;
- Call the detachment at 807-683-4200; or
- File a report online at https://www.opp.ca/index.php?id=132

#### The following can be reported online:

- Theft Under \$5,000
- Mischief / Damage to Property Under \$5,000
- Mischief / Damage to Vehicle Under \$5,000
- Theft from Vehicle Under \$5,000
- Lost / Missing Property Under \$5,000 including a license plate(s) or validation sticker(s)
- Theft of any type of gasoline from a gas station
- Driving Complaints

# The following should be reported in-person by calling the toll-free or detachment numbers:

- the occurrence happened outside of OPP jurisdiction
- there are any identifiable suspects
- someone was injured
- the occurrence involves a weapon
- the occurrence involves any damage to a motor vehicle due to an actual or apparent collision, including fail to remain collisions
- the occurrence involves a break and enter (e.g. unlawful entry and theft from a house, a building or a structure)
- the occurrence involves drugs or gambling (including lottery tickets)
- the occurrence involves a passport

The OPP use the data from calls to track patterns and create operational plans for patrolling and staffing. Residents are encouraged to report non-emergency events to help the detachment plan for where the resources are most needed.

#### How is the municipality billed for OPP Services?

The municipality is not billed on a per call basis. The majority of the cost for OPP services is based on the number of occupied properties within the municipality. There is an annual flat rate charge for each household and business. The rest of the cost is based on a percentage of municipal calls for service across the entire province and accounts for a small portion of the annual bill. If you would like more details about the cost for policing, please contact the municipal office.

#### **Summer Landfill Hours**

A reminder that summer hours start at the landfill on April 1st Saturdays: 9:00 am to 5:00 pm Sundays & Wednesdays: 4:00 pm to 8:00 pm



#### Garbage Punch Cards

Regular household garbage requires a punch on your Municipal Punch Card. Be sure to bring your punch card to the landfill each time. No punch card means you will not be permitted to dump your garbage.



#### Back to Bags for Plastics & Cans

Please BAG your plastics and cans. Clear and blue bags are recommended. Bags help to keep the mountain of recycling much more manageable. Cardboard does not have to be bagged, only flattened.

Sign up for Neebing's Emergency Text Alert Service. This text alert service is used to notify our residents <u>via text message</u> of immediate dangers or emergencies occurring in our community such as evacuations, road closures, forest fires and other hazards.

Sign up is free but you must have a smartphone equipped to receive text messages to use this service as it does not work on land lines. #### Key successes in Neebing's current waste management

Key achievements include establishing a structured recycling program, participating in food waste diversion programs and proactive public awareness initiatives to encourage participation. The municipality also facilitates the collection of specialized waste streams such as hazardous materials and electronics, often directing residents to external facilities or designated events.

#### **Food Waste Diversion**

The diversion of food waste from landfill sites has proven to have long-term benefits for both the environment and the life of landfill sites, according to studies based on pilot programs on food waste diversion across Canada. Besides significantly extending the lifespan of our landfill sites. Neebing has seen significant potential with the residents who have participated in the FoodCycler pilots. Further participation in the is food diversion program would only further enhance Neebing's waste management system.

The FoodCycler program involved providing participating households with small-scale electric food recycling units. These devices dehydrate and grind food scraps, significantly reducing their volume and creating a nutrient-rich material for soil amendment.

#### **Recycling Programs**

The municipality encourages source separation and collection of recyclable materials such as plastics, paper, and metals. Recycling saves everyone money and is environmentally friendly.

The municipality successfully transitioned to Ontario's producer responsibility model for Blue Box recycling on January 1, 2024. Under this model, container, packaging and printed paper producers are now responsible for collecting and managing these materials. This shift reduces the financial and operational burden away from the municipality.

Specific materials accepted in the Blue Box program include bagged plastics numbered 1 through 7; bagged cans/containers (aluminum and steel food/beverage containers); and cardboard (flattened to conserve space and improve processing efficiency).

#### **Special Waste Programs**

**Battery Recycling:** Collection points for used household batteries are available at each landfill site.

**Tires and Metal:** Tires and metal items such as appliances (must be freonfree), steel, copper, and aluminum may be placed at the designated location at both landfills sites.

**Fluorescent Lights:** Must be disposed of at designated locations (e.g., potentially the Thunder Bay Household Hazardous Waste Depot or designated collection events) due to their mercury content.

Retaining the pristine nature of our environment in Neebing and maximizing the efficiency of our landfill sites is a collective responsibility. Proper recycling and greater food waste diversion initiatives help the effort.



## **Playground Move and Expansion**

Reminder that the playground at the Municipal Office will be expanded and relocated in June to Century Park on the grounds of the Blake Hall and new Pavilion.

The playground will be temporarily closed starting June 9th so that it can be disassembled and moved. The playground should be set up and ready to use along with new accessible play features for the Canada Day Celebrations which will be held at Century Park, the Blake Hall, and Pavilion. The playground located at Alf Olsen Memorial Park (655 Highway 597) remains available for use.

## **Tax Bills and Potential Postal Strike**

Tax bills and landfill punch cards will be mailed at the end of June. If there is a postal strike, information regarding alternate ways to pick up your tax bill and punch cards will be available on the municipal website and Facebook page.

# **What's Been Happening at Council Meetings**

Since the May edition, there have been two regular meetings of Council on May 7 and 21, 2025 and two special meetings of Council on May 14, 2025. At the regular Council meeting on May 7th, the following matters were considered:

- Council made a temporary appointment to the Tender Review Committee.
- Council reviewed the provinces proposed Bill 5; Protecting Ontario by Unleashing Our Economy Act.

At the special Council meetings on May 14, 2025, Council awarded the contract for the construction of the fire bay addition at the municipal office and met with residents regarding a road encroachment matter.

At the regular Council meeting on May 21st, the following matters were considered:

- Council heard a presentation of the 2024 Financial Statements from the auditors.
- Council approved the 2024 Financial Statements and the 2025 Budget
- Council scheduled the summer Council meetings for July 16 and August 13, 2025.
- Council authorized Administration to apply for funding for a storage building and cistern at Blake Hall.
- Council directed Administration to sign up for the OPP's security camera registry.
- Council directed Administration to bring forward amendments to the landfill by-law to allow for purchased punch cards to have no expiry date

The next Council meetings will be held on May 7 and 21, 2025. Regular Council meetings are normally scheduled for the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month; however, there is only one meeting in January, July and August.

The minutes of each meeting are approved at the following meeting and are posted on the website once they have been approved and signed. If you don't have internet capabilities, you can always contact the office for copies of approved minutes.

# Stay Safe This Summer: Understanding and Treating Burns

Summer is a time to step away from our busy work schedules and enjoy moments of relaxation—whether that means lounging by the pool, embarking on road trips, or spending time camping with family. These moments often create lasting memories. However, summer activities can also pose certain risks, including burn injuries from sun exposure, campfires, and fireworks.

#### What Is a Burn?

A burn is an injury to the skin or underlying tissue caused by contact with heat sources such as fire, hot liquids, firecrackers, or the sun. While the skin is the most affected area, deeper tissues and internal structures can also be impacted. The severity of a burn is assessed by healthcare professionals based on its depth and the percentage of body surface area affected. Generally, the deeper and more extensive the burn, the more serious it is.

Burns are typically categorized into three types:

*Superficial burns:* Affect only the outer layer of skin (epidermis). These burns are painful and cause redness, like a mild sunburn. They usually heal within 3 to 5 days.

*Partial thickness burns:* Extend into the dermis and cause blistering, swelling, and more intense pain. Healing can take 10 to 15 days and may require medical evaluation.

*Full thickness burns:* The most severe type, these burns penetrate all layers of the skin and underlying tissues. They can result in permanent damage, scarring, and serious complications, requiring immediate medical intervention.

#### **Understanding Skin Structure**

The skin is the body's largest organ and plays a vital role in protection, temperature regulation, and sensation. It consists of three primary layers:

*Epidermis:* The outermost layer that provides a barrier against water, pathogens, mechanical and chemical trauma, and UV radiation. It also produces melanin and continuously regenerates skin cells.

Dermis: A thick layer of connective tissue containing blood vessels, lymph nodes, hair follicles, and glands. It provides strength and elasticity and supports immune defense.

*Hypodermis* (*subcutaneous tissue*): The deepest layer, which stores fat for energy, insulates the body, cushions internal organs, and connects the skin to muscles and bones.

#### **First Aid for Burns**

Prompt and appropriate first aid can significantly impact burn recovery: *Superficial Burns* 

- Cool the burn with cool (not cold) clean water for several minutes.
- Apply a soothing ointment such as aloe vera after cooling.
- Avoid using ice or overly cold water, which can worsen the injury or induce shock.

#### Partial Thickness Burns

- Cool the burn area with cool water.
- Carefully remove any jewelry or tight items near the burn to accommodate swelling.
- Do not burst any blisters, as they serve as natural protection.
- Seek medical attention for proper treatment and pain management—especially if the burn is larger than 2–3 cm or located on sensitive areas such as the face, hands, feet, genitals, buttocks, or joints.

#### Full Thickness Burns

- Immediately cool the affected area and cover it with a dry, sterile, non-adherent dressing.
- Do not apply ointments or break blisters.
- Seek emergency medical assistance immediately. These burns compromise all protective layers of the skin and require specialized care.

#### **Final Safety Tips**

As you enjoy your summer, remember to supervise children around campfires and fireworks, use sunscreen to prevent sunburn, and keep a first aid kit accessible. Being informed and prepared can make all the difference in preventing serious injuries.

Stay safe and make this summer both memorable and injury-free.

## **Celebrate Safely this Summer**

As the days grow warmer and celebrations light up the night sky, Neebing Emergency Services would like to remind our community that fireworks, while beautiful and exciting, must be handled with the utmost care and respect. Fireworks are explosives—and improper use can lead to serious injuries, fires, and damage to property. We're here to help ensure your summer celebrations are not only fun but safe for everyone involved.



#### Before You Light Up the Night

Know the Laws

Before purchasing or using fireworks, make sure they are legal in your area. In many municipalities, including certain parts of Neebing, specific bylaws regulate when and where fireworks can be discharged.

#### Buy from Trusted Sources

Only purchase fireworks from authorized, reputable retailers. Avoid homemade or altered fireworks—they are unpredictable and extremely dangerous.

#### Plan Ahead

Choose a wide, open space, far away from homes, trees, dry grass, and vehicles. Always have a bucket of water, sand, or a hose nearby for emergencies.



#### **Keep Safety Front and Centre**

Adult Supervision is Non-Negotiable

Fireworks should only be handled and lit by responsible adults. Children should never play with or light fireworks.

#### One at a Time

Only light one firework at a time, and never relight a "dud." Wait 20 minutes and soak it in water before disposing of it properly.

#### Stay Clear

Once lit, move back quickly, and maintain a safe distance. Keep spectators well away from the launch site.

#### No Alcohol Around Fireworks

Leave the fireworks to the sober adults. Alcohol and fire do not mix.

# Prevent Fires and Injury Protect Your Pets



Fireworks can frighten animals and cause them to run away or act out. Keep pets indoors and safe during fireworks displays.

#### Dispose Properly

Soak used fireworks in water before discarding them in a metal container. Never throw hot fireworks into regular garbage or compost.

#### Stay Alert to Fire Risks


Dry weather can increase fire danger. Be aware of local fire bans or advisories, and never use fireworks during high-risk periods.

As the weather warms up I hope you have the opportunity to get outside and enjoy the beauty of Neebing.

At this writing, I have just completed my first mow of the lawn, a Spring ritual. Since "no-mow May" has been found to be bad for the lawn and wildlife and of little use to pollinators, I am less hesitant to keep my lawn area in order.

I did have a wildflower area of lawn at my last house where delaying mowing resulted in pollinator-friendly flowers growing, but a normal lawn, left unmowed, usually produces only dandelions, creeping Charlie and Dutch white clover. While these do provide a bit of nectar, it isn't what bees really need to rear offspring - native plant pollen.

So I'm planting more native plants in my borders and mowing the small patch of grass when it's needed.

Another Spring ritual is NFRA Can Sorts. We are holding them every 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday until we get the huge pile collected over the winter, gone.

We'd love you to join us! It's a quick 2 hour (or whatever time you can spare) work-bee where we sort pop cans from beer cans from food cans, then count and bag the beer cans for return.

The amounts returned and recycled are amazing! Come meet some of your neighbours - we have a great core group that are supported by a crew of volunteers who come when they can...CAN! That's funny for a Can Sort (3)


