EMERGENCY TEXT ALERT SERVICE for Neebing Residents



Sign up for Neebing's Emergency Text Alert Service. This text alert service is used to notify our residents <u>via text message</u> of immediate dangers or emergencies occurring in our community such as evacuations, road closures, forest fires and other hazards.

Sign up is free but you must have a smartphone equipped to receive text messages to use this service as it does not work on land lines.

Your personal information is kept strictly confidential. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact us at the office.

Extreme Heat

Extreme heat can be dangerous for everyone, but people who work outdoors, the elderly, some people with disabilities, and children, particularly infants, are more vulnerable.

Hazard Information

Extreme heat can make you sick with heat stroke, heat rash and/or heat cramps.

Safety Tips

If you feel dizzy, weak or overheated:

- go to a cool place;
- sit or lie down;
- drink water;
- wash your face with cool water

If you don't feel better soon, seek medical help immediately.

If you are indoors:

- stay indoors to limit sun exposure
- take frequent cool showers or baths
- stay on lower floors if there's no air conditioning
- drink water and eat light, regular meals avoid using salt

Summer Landfill Hours

A reminder that summer hours start at the landfill on April 1st Saturdays: 9:00 am to 5:00 pm Sundays & Wednesdays: 4:00 pm to 8:00 pm



Garbage Punch Cards

Regular household garbage requires a punch on your Municipal Punch Card. Be sure to bring your punch card to the landfill each time. No punch card means you will not be permitted to dump your garbage.



Back to Bags for Plastics & Cans

Please BAG your plastics and cans. Clear and blue bags are recommended. Bags help to keep the mountain of recycling much more manageable. Cardboard does not have to be bagged, only flattened.

When to Contact the OPP

When to Call 911

If someone's health, immediate safety or property is threatened, call 911. When calling 911, be specific about what services(s) you need, ie: Police, Fire and/or Ambulance and provide as much detail as possible.

When to Call the Non-Emergency Line

For non-emergency events or minor crimes you can either:

- Call the 24-hour toll-free number at 1-888-310-1122;
- Call the detachment at 807-683-4200; or
- File a report online at https://www.opp.ca/index.php?id=132

The following can be reported online:

- Theft Under \$5,000
- Mischief / Damage to Property Under \$5,000
- Mischief / Damage to Vehicle Under \$5,000
- Theft from Vehicle Under \$5,000
- Lost / Missing Property Under \$5,000 including a license plate(s) or validation sticker(s)
- Theft of any type of gasoline from a gas station
- Driving Complaints


The following should be reported in-person by calling the toll-free or detachment numbers:

- the occurrence happened outside of OPP jurisdiction
- there are any identifiable suspects
- someone was injured
- the occurrence involves a weapon
- the occurrence involves any damage to a motor vehicle due to an actual or apparent collision, including fail to remain collisions
- the occurrence involves a break and enter (e.g. unlawful entry and theft from a house, a building or a structure)
- the occurrence involves drugs or gambling (including lottery tickets)
- the occurrence involves a passport

The OPP use the data from calls to track patterns and create operational plans for patrolling and staffing. Residents are encouraged to report non-emergency events to help the detachment plan for where the resources are most needed.

How is the municipality billed for OPP Services?

The municipality is not billed on a per call basis. The majority of the cost for OPP services is based on the number of occupied properties within the municipality. There is an annual flat rate charge for each household and business. The rest of the cost is based on a percentage of municipal calls for service across the entire province and accounts for a small portion of the annual bill. If you would like more details about the cost for policing, please contact the municipal office.

What's Been Happening at Council Meetings

Since the August edition, there has been one special Council meeting and one regular meeting of Council on August 13, 2025.

At the special Council meeting on August 13th, two applications for severance on Sturgeon Bay Road and Copper Cliff Road East were reviewed. At the regular Council meeting on August 13th, the following matters were considered:

- Council heard deputations regarding a proposed road near Van Johnson Boulevard and a proposed for a community-wide food waste diversion program.
- Council approved two applications for severance to create a total of three new lots.
- Council approved an updated Tax Collection Policy.
- Council approved the use of alternative voting methods for the 2026 municipal election.
- Council authorized staff to apply for funding to upgrade accessibility in Neebing parks.
- Council passed a resolution to support and promote renewable energy sources within Neebing.
- Council passed by-laws to appoint an Integrity Commissioner and Closed Meeting Investigator; and to adopt playground rules.

The next Council meetings will be held on September 3 and 17, 2025. Regular Council meetings are normally scheduled for the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month; however, there is only one meeting in January, July and August.

This article contains only highlights from Council meetings – visit the website to see the approved minutes from each of the meetings. The minutes of each meeting are approved at the following meeting and are posted on the website once they have been approved and signed. If you don't have internet capabilities, you can always contact the office for copies of approved minutes.

Meeting agendas are always posted online on the Friday prior to the Wednesday meeting. Come out and see what your Council is doing on your behalf. Feel free to contact the Municipal Office for further information or with input into any of the items that Council is considering. The meetings are now being held at the Municipal Office, but there is the option to attend virtually as well. The links to login to the meetings are posted on our website in the calendar details.



School Buses Are Back on the Roads

As summer comes to a close, families shift from vacation mode to back-to-school routines. With school buses once again navigating our roads, it's vital that we all take the necessary steps to keep children safe — whether they're riding the bus or sharing the road with one.

At Neebing Emergency Services, we hope your summer was filled with joy and memories. Now, as we return to the school year, let's work together to ensure every child has a safe journey to and from school.

Bus Safety Tips for Students

Before Boarding the Bus

- Wait in a safe spot, away from the edge of the road.
- Only approach the bus once it has come to a complete stop, with its red overhead lights flashing or stop arm extended.

While Riding the Bus

- Find a seat promptly and remain seated, facing forward.
- Keep aisles clear of bags and other belongings.
- Keep arms, hands, and head inside the bus at all times.
- Follow the driver's instructions and avoid causing distractions.

When Leaving the Bus

- Exit in a calm, single-file line—no pushing or shoving.
- Always cross in front of the bus, never behind.
- Make eye contact with the driver and wait for their signal before crossing.
- Stay at least 10 giant steps (about 3 meters) away from the bus so both you and the driver can see each other.
- Walk don't run when crossing the street.

Driver Safety Tips When Sharing the Road

Approaching a School Bus

- Flashing amber lights mean the bus is about to stop. Slow down and prepare to stop.
- Flashing **red lights** or an extended stop arm mean the bus is stopped for loading or unloading. **You must stop.**

Stopping Requirements

- From behind the bus: Stop at least 20 metres back.
- From the opposite direction: Stop a safe distance away unless separated by a median.

It Is Illegal and Dangerous to Pass a Stopped School Bus

Passing a stopped school bus with its red lights flashing or stop arm out can endanger children and carries serious consequences.

Penalties for Violating School Bus Laws

- First offence: \$400–\$2,000 fine + 6 demerit points.
- Subsequent offences: Up to \$4,000 fine, 6 demerit points, and possible imprisonment for up to 6 months.

Enforcement Measures

Stop Arm Cameras

Many school buses are now equipped with stop arm cameras. If your vehicle is captured illegally passing a stopped bus, the registered owner may be charged and fined — even if they weren't driving at the time.

Reporting Violations

If you witness a driver failing to stop:

- Call 911 immediately.
- Provide the vehicle's license plate number, description, and exact location of the incident.

Let's Keep Our Kids Safe

Every member of the community has a role to play in protecting our children. We at Neebing Emergency Services are always ready to respond in case of emergency — but we hope we're never needed for incidents involving school transportation.

Let's all do our part: **STOP, WAIT, THEN CONTINUE.**

Staying Bear-Safe This September

As summer begins to wind down and the days grow shorter, Neebing Emergency Services is reminding all residents to remain vigilant and proactive when it comes to bear safety. September is a critical time of year, as local bear activity typically increases with the approach of winter hibernation. During this period, bears are actively foraging and can become bolder in their search for food. This is known as the hyperphagia phase, where bears consume large amounts of calories to prepare for the colder months ahead. As a result, sightings and encounters in both rural and semi-urban areas of Neebing are not uncommon.

Bear Safety Tips for September:

1. Secure All Garbage

Store garbage in bear-resistant containers or keep it inside a secure building until collection day. Never leave food waste outside overnight.

2. Remove Attractants

Do not leave pet food, birdseed, or ripe fruit from trees and gardens unattended outdoors. These are strong attractants for bears.

3. Clean BBQs and Outdoor Cooking Equipment

Grease and food residue can lure bears from long distances. Always clean grills thoroughly after use.

4. Use Motion-Activated Lights

Installing lighting around your property can deter bears during nighttime hours.

5. Travel Smart

When hiking, make noise to avoid surprising a bear. Travel in groups and keep pets leashed at all times.

6. Report Sightings Promptly

If you spot a bear near a home, school, or public area, report it to the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry Bear Wise line at 1-866-514-2327. In emergencies, call 911.

Who to contact

Not every bear sighting is an emergency. Here is who to call if you encounter a bear.

EMERGENCY SITUATIONS

Call 911 or your local police if a bear poses an immediate threat to personal safety and exhibits threatening or aggressive behaviour, such as:

- enters a school yard when school is in session
- · stalks people and lingers at the site
- · enters or tries to enter a residence
- · wanders into a public gathering
- kills livestock/pets and lingers at the site

Police will respond first to an emergency situation but may request assistance from the ministry during daylight hours.

NON-EMERGENCY SITUATIONS

Call the toll-free Bear Wise reporting line at 1-866-514-2327 or TTY 705-945-7641 if a bear:

- · roams around or checks garbage cans
- breaks into a shed where garbage or food is stored
- is in a tree
- pulls down a bird feeder or knocks over a barbecue
- moves through a backyard or field but does not linger

This line operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, from April 1 to November 30.



When Neebing initiated the punch card system for our landfills, we thought this would be a good way to track our "garbage" throughout the year. We are a 2-person household with the regular blip of children and grandchildren visiting. We practiced the following with

- our household garbage:All that can be recycled is:
- o All allowable plastics
- o Paper and cardboard
- o Aluminum and metal cans for NFRA
- We utilize a FoodCycler for all our green waste except for

pork/beef bones and high starch items such as bread and potato peels. Potato peels go into our compost barrel and the whiskey jacks and blue jays get the bread.

• Glass is taken to the Thunder Bay recycle depot.

The result – from July 31, 2024 to August 1, 2025 we had 18 bags of garbage (18 punches) going into the hole! If we took into account the time we were away from home that may have added two more bags to the total. Sure, it takes some time for recycling (cleaning/sorting) but we only made


Sure, it takes some time for recycling (cleaning/sorting) but we only made 10 trips to the landfill, saving us time, wear and tear on our vehicle and GAS! Also, we had no issues with animals getting into our garbage.

The system works and we can extend the life of our two landfills. The system will work even better if, in the future, more people can take part in the FoodCycler program and if the province expands the eligible blue box materials to include other materials such as glass.



Emergency Response Registry



Lake Superior's water level rose 13 centimetres between the beginning of July 2025 and beginning of August 2025 which is the 3rd largest rise on record. The beginning of August level is 5 centimetres below the Beginning-of-Month Average (1918-2024). It is likely that the lake level has peaked during the month of August and will begin its seasonal decline within the next month.

It's hard to believe that Summer is already on its way out, but that means Autumn is around the corner! The Fall is a wonderful time to explore a Conservation Area. The Fall colours will be starting soon, and the weather will be cooling off which means less bugs.
